### NEWS FROM NURSE ASHLEY

**Head lice:** TPS policy states that a student with live lice may not be in school. We have been working with families of students that have had lice to treat it. The first symptom that is usually seen is frequent scratching of the head, if you see your student doing this please check them or notify me and I will check them. Please remind your child not to share hair accessories or hats, to not play with each other's hair and to keep their coats and book bags in their cubbies.

**Flu season reminders:** Please keep students with flu symptoms home. Flu symptoms include: Fever over 100, muscle aches and pains, headache, sore throat, or cough. Proper hand washing is your best defense against getting the flu!

**Attention parents of 6<sup>th</sup> graders and incoming kindergarteners:** Is your student up to date on their immunizations? ### **EPWORTH CHURCH-HAWKINS SCHOOL PARTNERSHIP**

As the new year begins, we'd like to share with you some of the ways Epworth volunteers have served at Hawkins since the start of the 2018-19 school year:
