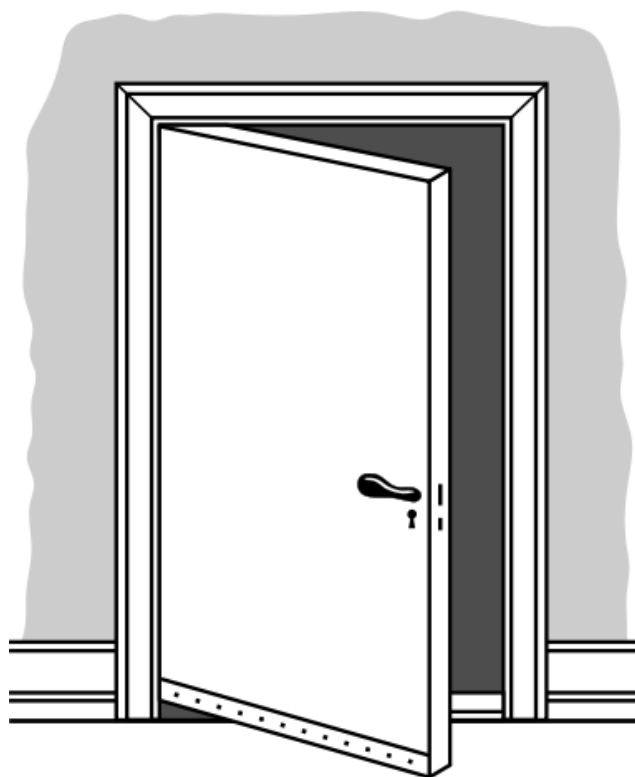

What's Trending- the Laundry Pod Challenge

This is a current “dare” that has nothing to do with laundry and everything to do with getting “internet famous.” The videos that have spread across social media look like this—laughing, joking teens sink their teeth into one of the colorful laundry pods, then cough and gag while toxic, stain-fighting chemicals ooze from their mouths.

The American Association of Poison Control Centers report that these pods have caused children to be hospitalized with difficulty breathing, loss of consciousness, and temporary vision loss due to chemical burns to the eye. Consumer Reports says the ingredients in the laundry pods can

burn the mouth, digestive system and stomach, cause gastrointestinal distress and respiratory arrest. If the laundry pods make their way into the bloodstream or organs, they can be fatal.

What is a parent to do? Talk with your child about this and other online challenges. Below are some tips to keep in mind as you talk to your teen:

- State the obvious
- Prompt critical thinking: Ask, “What do you think could happen if you do this?”
- Keep it positive: youth are hard-wired to defend against negative messages or scare tactics. Talk about what your child should do-resist peer pressure.
- Don’t assume your child won’t try it: Impulsivity along with peer pressure are powerful influences.
- Set clear boundaries: Share your expectations of acceptable and unacceptable behavior.
